**DESCRIPTION**

**Objectives:**

1. Review the considerations for establishing RIC
2. Review the basic equipment / tool cache for establishing RIC
3. Review PAC-CAN for assessing a downed Firefighter
4. Review the components of the RIC Pack and options for providing Air Supply to a downed Firefighter
5. Review options for packaging and removing a downed Firefighter

**Description / Outline:**

1. Establishing RIC
  - A Rapid Intervention Crew should be established on any working fire incident
  - **Level I RIC** – Engine Co.
  - **Level II RIC** – Engine & Truck (or 2 Companies with the necessary tools)
  - **Level III RIC** – Engine, Truck, & Rescue
2. Basic Equipment / Tool Cache
  - RIC Pack, Large Area Search Bag, Irons
  - This is a minimum equipment cache, allowing the crew to operate efficiently
  - The complexity of the building or event may warrant additional tools
3. PAC-CAN Assessment
  - **P** – Pass Device (Turn it OFF)
  - **A** – Assess
  - **C** – Communicate
  - **C** – Conditions
  - **A** – Actions
  - **N** – Needs
4. Air Supply
  - RIC UAC Connection
  - EBSS (Buddy-Breather)
  - MMR Swap
  - Mask Change
5. Packaging / Drags & Carries
  - SCBA Harness Conversion
  - RIC Rescue Tarp
  - Horizontal Drags
  - Up/Down Stairs
  - Obstacles / Up & Over / Low Profile
